

July to September 2025 were truly energizing months at the Shooting Stars Foundation as we continued our mission to transform lives education. through innovation. and empowerment. The quarter was marked by the much-awaited SSF Annual Family Meet 2025, entrepreneurship and STEM camps that ignited creativity, and international showcases that celebrated our scholars' achievements on a global stage; a testament to the collective spirit of learning, leadership, and impact that drives SSF forward. Where Innovation Meets Empowerment

WWT All India Women-Only Hackathon 2025

From July 5 to 13, 2025, the second edition of the WWT All India Women-Only Hackathon became a powerhouse of innovation, collaboration, and inspiration. Over 6,000 young women from across India — 40% from low-income families or first-generation graduates — came together to tackle real-world challenges using Al for financial literacy and economic empowerment.

Forming 1,075 teams, these changemakers submitted more than 700 groundbreaking ideas, from Al-driven rural banking assistants to budgeting tools designed for women entrepreneurs. Guided by expert mentors from the World Wide Technology (WWT), 25 finalist teams refined their solutions and turned bold ideas into tangible prototypes.

The impact was profound:

- 92% of participants reported feeling more confident applying AI to realworld problems
- 68% expressed a desire to volunteer with SSF to mentor future cohorts
- And nearly every finalist said the experience inspired them to pursue careers in tech, data science, or social entrepreneurship

This wasn't just a hackathon — it was a launchpad for women innovators shaping the future of technology and inclusion in India.

SSF Team Meet, Bengaluru

On July 22–23, 2025, members of the SSF team came together in Bengaluru for an energizing two-day meet filled with rich discussions, fresh ideas, and plenty of camaraderie.

We were privileged to be joined by SSF India Board Members Mr. Venkatanathan R and Mr. Panduranga Rao whose guidance and vision brought valuable perspective and helped us reflect on ways to strengthen our impact — both across India and globally.







Of course, no SSF gathering is complete without moments of laughter and shared experiences! From enjoying a classic South Indian thali to exchanging stories, hobbies, and aspirations, the meet reminded us of the vibrant community that binds us together.

Though our team spans cities and continents, these in-person connections reaffirm that we're more than a remote team — we're a united force driven by purpose, passion, and the belief that education can transform lives.

Amgen STEM Entrepreneurship Program - Tampa & Thousand Oaks

From July 21–24 in Tampa and July 28–31 in Thousand Oaks, the Amgen STEM Entrepreneurship Program brought together more than 300 high school students for two dynamic camps designed to spark innovation and entrepreneurial thinking.

In Tampa, over 100 students immersed themselves in the startup journey — from user research and product design to pitch decks and financial modeling. A week later in Thousand Oaks, 200+ students joined in, marking another year of remarkable growth and impact.





Guided by mentors from Amgen, Google, NVIDIA, and Khan Academy, participants developed groundbreaking ideas — from AI-powered health solutions to financial literacy apps for teens. The results were inspiring:

- 16 startup ideas were pitched to judges, with several already being refined postcamp
- Students reported greater confidence in leadership, communication, and financial planning
- For many, it was their first time envisioning a future in technology, design, or entrepreneurship.

Richmond Youth Financial Literacy & Coding Camp



In partnership with Richmond YouthWORKS and funded by the Richmond ECIA grant, nearly 50 local youth completed a transformative two-week camp, culminating on July 31.

By the finale, students who had never before worked with budgets or coding were able to:

- Read pay stubs and balance monthly budgets
- Showcase Python-powered projects at Richmond City Hall
- Earn a \$500 stipend for their dedication and hard work

"They're walking away with skills that will serve them for life," shared Vanessa, our program lead — and we couldn't agree more!





DHDCBioinformatics Camp

The Detroit Hispanic Development Corporation (DHDC), in collaboration with the Shooting Stars Foundation (SSF), conducted two engaging Bioinformatics Camps this year — a virtual camp from July 28–30 and an inperson session from August 4–6 at the DHDC office in Detroit.

The camps introduced students, including many from the Hispanic community, to the interdisciplinary world of bioinformatics where biology and technology come together solve complex scientific challenges. Through interactive sessions. hands-on activities. expert-led discussions. and participants explored how data-driven science is transforming healthcare, genetics, and research.







Students displayed exceptional curiosity and enthusiasm, bringing forward bright ideas and a deep interest in STEM innovation. Their active participation underscored the growing potential of young minds to drive future advancements in science and technology.






Inspiring Voices, Lasting Wisdom








SIEMENS ENERGY – Girls with Energy Online Hackathon

The Girls with Energy Online Hackathon, powered by Siemens Energy in collaboration with the Shooting Stars Foundation (SSF), was held on September 13–14, 2025, bringing together bright young minds from across the U.S. and Canada to innovate for a cleaner, more sustainable future.

This initiative, part of Siemens Energy's Girls with Energy program, aimed to encourage more female participation in the energy sector by giving students a platform to design technology-driven solutions for realworld challenges. **Participants** energy benefited from expert mentorship, collaborative problem-solving sessions, and the opportunity to learn new technologies, network with industry professionals, and win exciting prizes.

The hackathon received an overwhelming 216 registrations, including 190 from the United States and 26 from Canada. Of these, 147 were high school students and 69 were from middle schools, with a total of 171 participants completing the event.

Through this initiative, Siemens Energy and SSF continue to empower young women to lead the charge toward a more sustainable energy future, nurturing a generation of innovators ready to make a lasting impact.
